



**Statement by the Student Parliament on
the Admission of Our Fellow Student Samana Mohammadi**

The Student Parliament of Alice Salomon University Berlin calls on the relevant authorities to immediately honor the admission offer extended to our fellow student Samana Mohammadi, thereby enabling her to enter Germany and begin her studies at our university.

Samana worked as a social worker for German organizations in Afghanistan. She helped women in forced marriages to free themselves from these unions and, because of her work, was subjected to severe threats and attacks by the Taliban. She fled to Pakistan after the Taliban seized power in 2021, following a promise by German authorities that she would be admitted to the Federal Republic of Germany.

We consider the German government's 2025 message to Samana—stating that the German authorities no longer have any “political interest” in her admission—to be unacceptable and inhumane.

We support Samana's network of supporters, which ensures that Samana's arrival in Germany and the start of her studies are socially and financially secured and which is effectively advocating publicly for her admission.

We recall the words from a student speech delivered at a student-organized rally in front of the Federal Foreign Office on February 6, 2026, and we align ourselves with them:

„If this woman dies, then it was not a natural disaster.
Then it was not an unfortunate chain of circumstances.
Then it was a deliberate political and active decision.“

We also support our university's initiative to build public pressure to compel the federal government to honor its promise of admission. The petition for Samana's admission has

now been signed by nearly 34,000 people—this is a clear statement from civil society advocating for a dignified life and survival for our fellow student, as well as a call to our government to act in accordance with its own mandate.

We condemn the federal government for no longer having “any political interest” in admitting Samana to the Federal Republic. It has no interest in ensuring that Samana can live a dignified life free from violence and the threat of death. It has no interest in ensuring that arbitrary political calculations do not endanger human lives and fail to recognize their value. It is unworthy of a federal government to turn its back on human lives out of political disinterest.

We strongly condemn the government's declaration that it has "no political interest" anymore in accepting Samana into the Federal Republic. In doing so, it creates the impression of having no interest in ensuring that Samana can live a dignified life free from violence and threatened death. It also seems to show no interest in the fact that arbitrary political calculations endanger human lives and fail to assign value to such life. It is unworthy of this country and its government to decide against human lives out of political disinterest – despite previously made clear commitments.
